Professional Experience:

I recently transitioned from an inpatient teacher role with the Learning Services team to Brain Injury Educational Coordinator within the Rehab Department. I've worked for the hospital for almost 8 years and had the awesome opportunity to start the first classroom at Children's Hospital Colorado on the rehab floor for children with acquired brain injuries and spinal cord injuries a little over 5 years ago. Through this classroom I was able work directly with students with severe TBI and spinal cord injuries daily in a multidisciplinary setting, so I could better inform the return to school process using the principles of cognitive rehabilitation.



I served children on other units through our bedside teaching model as well, but rehab and brain injury have always been my primary population served and my greatest areas of passion. In my new role, I am continuing to build the transition from inpatient to outpatient program for students with severe brain injuries, and I am also supporting the concussion population at Children's Hospital Colorado. I am still connected to the rehab classroom through close collaboration with the new rehab teacher. I work closely with families, physicians, neuropsychologists, rehab psychologists, and school districts in the state and region wide to successfully transition children into school as well as assist to design appropriate instructional models during recovery.

I learned about AECMN last year when I submitted an abstract for a poster presentation at the St. Pete's conference. I thoroughly enjoyed meeting other professionals, and I find the collaboration paramount in improving my practice and the programs I support in Colorado.
